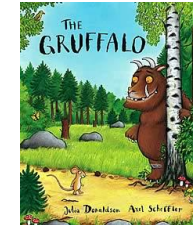

Literacy

- The Gruffalo wanted a midnight feast, what would your dream midnight feast be? Draw and write a list of all your favourite foods you would like to eat.
- Write a set of instructions or a list of ingredients to make Gruffalo Pie, cake or tea.

Maths

- Use your number tiles you have made place them on the floor upside down, turn one number tile at a time. Using everyday objects at home for example, pasta shells can you count out the correct number of pasta shells from a large group of pasta shells to match the number you have turned over?

Media and materials

- The Gruffalo Child's toy is a Stickman, collect some natural materials from your garden can you make a Stickman or toy for the Gruffalo's Child to play with?
- Create your own character puppets from the story and put on your own show.
- Plan your own Gruffalo tea party or picnic lunch invite you animal Teddies. Take a photo of your tea party if you wish and post onto Evidence Me.

Language and communication

- Look at the animals in the book, think about what camouflage means. Why might the animals need to hide?
- If you were to go on an adventure like the Gruffalo's Child, where would you go, what would you see? Discuss this with your adults at home

Knowledge and Understanding

- Lots of the animals who live in the woods can camouflage well to hide from other animals can you name woodland creatures that may need camouflage and why?

Tell your adult about an imaginary creature that lives in the woods, what does it eat, where does it live what does it look

Internet Safety

Can you check the devices your children are using at home and ensure they have parental restrictions on and you know which apps they are using.
