Below is the information you need for your child to access Lexia and Mathletics. This should be accessed daily, if possible.

### Lexia

Lexia Reading Core5® can be used at home for extra practice. Getting started is easy!

1. To use on a computer, go to [www.lexiacore5.com](http://www.lexiacore5.com).
2. To use on an iPad, download the free **Lexia Core5 Reading app** from the App Store. (iPad support is limited to these devices: iPad 4+, iPad Mini 3+, iPad Air+, and iPad Pro.)
3. The first time your child uses Core5, you may need to enter the teacher email shown below. Your child can then log in with the username and password used at school and listed below.

Below are some activities for you to complete whilst you are working at home:

### Literacy

- Keep a diary of the activities you do at home. Record anything unusual that you do or anything new that you try. You can record your activities by writing or drawing.
- Create a story about a teddy or toy that has come to life. What adventures will it get up to? It could build a rocket and go up into space or pack up a bag of exciting things and go to the beach. Get creative!
- Read as many story books as you can. Take photos of you reading all around the house. I'm sure that your teddies would love to hear your stories.

### Maths

- Go on a shape hunt around the house. How many different 2d and 3d shapes can you find?
- Fun in the bath! Empty your kitchen cupboards of pots and pans and learn about different volumes of liquids. Whilst in the bath, compare amounts of water and find out which containers hold the most/least.
- Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables, until you know them by heart. Get an adult in your house to test you on them. Use your toys to help you. Can you sort them into groups of 2, 5 and 10?

### Topic

- Go on a minibeast hunt in the garden. How many different creatures can you find? What do they look like? How many legs do they have? Take photos of any unusual minibeasts that you find or the strangest places that you find them in.
- Design or make a miniature garden. Instead of throwing out empty cardboard boxes and milk cartons, use them to create an exciting garden full of plants and minibeasts.

We are sure that you will also think of some fabulous activities of your own to do while you are at home. We would love you to share them with us when you come back to school.
