Reading

Shape

Create a mind-map of everything that you know about shapes.

Can you name any 2D or 3D shapes?

What facts can you write about a cube?

How many sides does an octagon have?

Using your knowledge of different shapes and their properties, create a quiz to test a family member!



Writing

If you could live a day in the life of any animal, what animal would you be?

Imagine that you have transformed into an animal for a day! Write a short story about how the transformation happened and about what you get up to during the day.

Do you turn up to school as an animal?

Do your family realise that you have turned into the family pet?

Spelling

Words ending in 'tion'

How many words can you write down which end in 'tion'?

Write down a list of the words that you can think of and then choose 5 words to write a definition of.

Ask an adult to give you a mini spelling test on 10 of the words – can you spell them correctly?



Science

Create a poster to explain the different animal classifications: **mammals, birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and insects.**

Try to include some information about the features of the animals in each group.

Can you draw some examples of animals from each classification?

Art

Observational Drawing

Choose a collection of objects from your home and place them together on a surface – you could place them as carefully or as crazily as you wish (just be careful not to break anything!).

Sketch the objects in front of you, paying particular attention to the shape and sizes of each item.

Can you add shading to your image?
