

Fun Maths

How many different animals are in the story? Can you find farm animals in your house, how many do you have do you have more or less? Can you create your own number bonds to 10 recording them as an addition and subtraction? E.g 8

$$+ 2 = 10 \quad 10 - 2 = 8$$

Roll a dice to add the dots onto a ladybird, what do the dots of both wings equal? What would happen if you added another animal? Practise one more and one less than a given number.



Creative

Can you make your own animal puppets? Once you have created your puppets you can use them as props when retelling the story. Create ladybirds using a toilet roll / kitchen roll tube to create a body and add wings and a face using card.

Hope you have lots of fun!

Using plain paper, can you put the numbers 1-20 on them? Ask your child to go to a certain number ask them to move up and down the number line to solve a number problem. E.g $3 + 6 =$ Step on a number, what is one more or one less, repeat.



Can you create a map, drawing the route clearly, ending with an x marks the spot? This can be of a farm, the story or an adventure or walk you may have been on with your families. You could also create a simple map of your house and then write clues for your parents / siblings to follow to find the hidden treasure (this could be your favourite toy). They may then create clues and a map for you to follow.
