Your child could share a book everyday. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult.• Snuggle up together and read and re-read your favourite books.• Listen to 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Cat'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kSlaOU3Crts• Write a book review on The Lighthouse Keeper's Cat - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone?• Read a short article from a local newspaper with your adult.• Find and read a non-fiction book about the seaside. Discuss the differences between a fiction book and a non-fiction book.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work on Mathletics - your child will have an individual login to access this. https://login.mathletics.com/• Play on Hit the Button - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/mathsgames/hit-the-button• Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.• Practise telling the time. Read to the hour and half hour.• Write the numbers 0 – 100 in digits.• Select a number between 20 and 50. Make a poster showing how many different ways to make this number, using addition, subtraction, multiplication etc.• How many objects can you find in your house that are blue, red, yellow and green? Try to use a tally chart to show your answers.

Who will be the main characters? Which seaside will they use? What will happen in their story?
<p>Learning project for this week: At the seaside</p> <p>The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of being at the seaside. Learning may focus on seaside activities, water safety and how Redcar has changed over the years.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Redcar: This is the time to talk about where you live and to talk about the changes in the local area. Ask your child to think about: What is near their home? How many shops are close by? What can they do in Redcar? What local transport can they use? How do you travel around as a family? If possible, show them pictures of Redcar when you were younger. Ask the children to look at any differences. Find a map and ask them to locate Redcar on it. Compare Redcar to another town in the Tees Valley. What differences and similarities do they notice?• Make a list: Ask your child to think about which materials they could use to make a lighthouse and to write them down. Can they find these different materials around the house?• Create a postcard: Ask your child to imagine that they are at the seaside and to design a postcard for someone in their family. What information will they include?• Draw: Look at different seaside landscapes. Ask your child to choose their favourite and to draw it themselves. Can they draw different sea creatures too?• Design your own swimming costume: Ask your child to come up with a completely new and unique design for a swimming costume? How many designs can they create?• Try to make your own hat: Using different materials in the house ask your child to make their own hat. Ask them to think about the best materials to use and discuss why they are the best e.g. light / heavy / waterproof / transparent etc. Think about the following: Does the hat fit on their head? Is it too heavy? Are they happy with their design? Take some pictures so that they can show their classmates.• Take a walk in your local area: Try to find different landmarks. How many can you see? Write them down or draw them.• Songs: Think of different seaside songs. You can use the following website to give you some ideas 'BBC Primary Music KS1: Sun, sea and song!'
