Find 4 different materials in your house e.g. wood, card, plastic and cloth. Make a prediction of which material will cause the most friction. Create a 'ramp' covered in each material to slide a toy car down. Which ramp does it travel down the quickest? Which ramp creates the greatest amount of friction?
