Weekly Reading Tasks (aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Daily phonics - Read Write Inc. Speed Sounds. Open YouTube and watch live Read Write Inc. Speed Sounds Set 2 video. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=p7hRbrpg5Bo• Log into Lexia - your child has an individual login to access this. www.lexiacore5.com/login• Read a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book every day. This can be reading a book aloud every day or sharing a book with an adult.• Snuggle up together and read and reread your favourite books.• Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding?• Listen to this story 'Winnie and Wilbur under the sea' https://youtu.be/DYhsiOvLcBk• Find a set of instructions for making a sandwich to take to the seaside. Read the instructions out aloud. Can you follow the instructions and make a sandwich? Remember to eat it once you have it!• Read a non-fiction book. Discuss the differences between a fiction book and a non-fiction book.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work on Mathletics - your child has an individual login to access this. https://login.mathletics.com/• Play on 'Hit the Button' - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/mathsgames/hit-the-button• Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Practise your odd and even numbers.• Practise telling the time. Read to the hour and half hour.• Write the numbers 50 - 70 in digits.• Practise making different shapes using an online geoboard. https://apps.mathlearningcenter.org/geoboard/ Once you have made the shape from one view, can you make it from another? How do you know it is still the same shape?• You could explore making 2D shapes in two ways: with their bodies, e.g. lie on the floor to make a triangle, or using large loops of string/ribbon.



Learning Project for this week: Ahoy There Matey

- **Listen to Sounds from the beach** – The Seaside <https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/radio/sounds-like-fun-seaside>
 - **Use a google image search** to look at photos of all the sounds they heard. Talk about how we can use the internet to find information.
 - **Look at a collection of shells** you have in your home or find a photograph on the internet of lots of different types of shells. Ask your child if they can see any that look the same or different. Talk about their size, shape, and colour. Look for patterns on the shells. Do you know of any creature that might have lived in the shell?
 - **Help your child make a seagull** from a paper plate or white paper



- **Make a picture of the sea using paint.** Talk about the colour of the seas. Mix white with blue to make the blue lighter and black to make it darker. Look at all the different shades and tones used in the picture. Fill the whole page.



- **Listen to the song I do like to be beside the seaside:**

Encourage clapping to the beat. Make the drum from pack one or encourage using the drum they made in pack one. Play to the beat. Make a drum from a wooden spoon and pan or any other objects around the house. Play to the beat. Discuss if the instruments sounds the same.
