Speed Sounds Set 2 video. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=p7hRbrpg5Bo• Log into Lexia - your child has an individual login to access this. www.lexiacore5.com/login• Read a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book every day. This can be reading a book aloud every day or sharing a book with an adult.• Snuggle up together and read and reread your favourite books.• Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Practise your place value by counting the tens and ones and even the hundreds if you want to challenge yourself.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If you have a sandpit make a sandcastle. Investigate how to stop them falling down. Add water to dry sand. Pat sand firmly in the bucket. Encourage learning from their mistakes. While making sandcastles use the terms full, empty, nearly full and nearly empty.• Google image search to look at photos of different sandcastles created and maybe try and recreate them. Talk about how we can use the internet to find information.• Make a parrot puppet - from paper, cardboard or material whatever is the most available in your house.  <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Make a map of your own. Have a go at making your own map. You could try hiding some treasure and then giving the map to someone in your family to find it from using your amazing map.• Design your own pirate flag for your pirate ship. Use different colours and think about the textures you will use on your flag.  <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Listen to the song 'Row, row, row your boat'. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rafox-9P3r8 Encourage clapping to the beat. Make a drum from a wooden spoon and pan or any other objects around the house. Play to the beat. Discuss if the instruments sounds the same.
