Bull's eye

Ali is playing a darts game. He chooses a number to be the bull's eye and then throws four darts to see what numbers they land on. He can only use +, ×, - and ÷ and the four numbers in any order to reach his target. How does he do it? The first one has been done for you.

Bull's eye: 33
Darts: 9 6 7 9
Answer: $(9 \times 9) - (7 \times 6) = 39$

Bull's eye: 450
Darts: 12 3 2 15

Do you know the saying 'Beware of Greeks bearing gifts'? How could it apply to this picture?


